Our organization will be changing its name, just a little. We'll be shortening it. We will be the **SUANHACKY CAMPERSHIP ASSOCIATION**.

In late 1985, Mitch Morgenstern gathered some fellow Scouters and friends of the late Jack Kohler, to figure out a way to honor him. Jack had been the Queens Camping Chairman for more than 25 years and had two tenures as Advisor of Suanhacky Lodge. So, the natural thing to do was help both TMR, and Suanhacky Lodge. It was decided that helping Scouts go to TMR would help the camp as well as allow for those camping Scouts to then become eligible to be inducted into the Order of the Arrow; hence the Jack Kohler Campership Association was born in 1986.

Then in 2012 when it was announced that GNYC would merge the 5 NYC OA lodges into one lodge, we decided to add Suanhacky to our name to keep it alive in the hearts and memories of Queens Scouts & Scouters past and present.

As time goes on, we find fewer and fewer people knew about or recognized the name, Jack Kohler and it became, to a small degree, an issue when trying to promote our organization and its purpose.

After lengthy discussion, our Board of Directors voted to shorten the name to **Suanhacky Campership Association**. It is our feeling that this will be more recognizable and associated with Queens Scouting and Camping. **NOTHING ELSE ABOUT WHO WE ARE AND WHAT WE DO WILL CHANGE**. Our dual purposes remain:

- 1- To perpetuate the feeling of fellowship, love of camping and Scout Spirit that Suanhacky Lodge strived to do.
- 2- To provide **financial assistance** to Queens Boy Scouts so that they may attend the long-term Summer Scout Camp of Greater New York Councils, Ten Mile River.

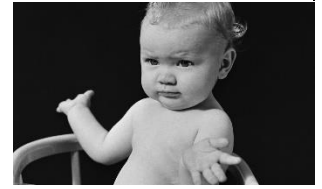

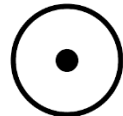

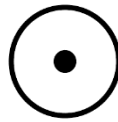

GONE HOME- MARGE NOONI

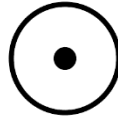
It has been a very difficult year, not made any easier to deal with, when we lose people we admire, love and cherish. Such a person was **Marguerite 'Marge' Nonni**.

Carl Hertenstein was a longtime member of Suanhacky Lodge and a TMR Staffman. Including being Director of TMR Family Camp in the 1970's. Once Carl moved to New Jersey and eventually Florida, he stayed in touch with his Queens friends, but wasn't always able to come north. The last time many saw him was at the TMR 90th reunion.



Carl was a veteran of the US Army, serving a year in Vietnam and received multiple awards, including a Bronze Star Medal with a "V" Device.

The Boy Scouts was a lifelong passion for Carl. He began as a Cub Scout at age 8 and ultimately an Eagle Scout and was still actively involved at age 74. He was also active on the Queens Camping Committee, helping to promote camp to many Scouts throughout Queens. He was a recipient of the Silver Beaver Award (NJ Council). After moving to Florida, his involvement in scouting did not wane. He became a Unit Commissioner and District Member-at-Large was Faculty on the College of Commissioner Science and very involved with the start-up of Sea Scout Ship 210 at Davis Island in Tampa. After the start-up, Carl was 1st Mate on the ship. He also served on the Board of the Sea Venturers of Florida Inc. He was a mentor to countless young boys and his achievements and awards speak loudly for his lifelong commitment.
